



Sherman County Local Community Advisory Council 2016 Community Health Improvement Plan

There were five areas that were prioritized by the group to be included through the Sherman Community Health Assessment process:

1. **Clinicians and Access**
2. **Mental Health**
3. **Incentive Measures**
4. **Children’s Health Promotion**
5. **Oral Health**

1. Clinicians and Access: The overarching goal for Clinicians and Access is to assist the Moro Clinic attain Patient Centered Primary Care Home (PCPCH) recognition.

SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES:

Expanded Access - Monitor implementation of the 24 hour / 7 day a week telephone access system to primary care supported by the Incentive Measure resources.

Measure 1: Existence and utilization measures of 24/7 service.

Care Coordination – Continue to support the care coordination function through the integration of behavioral health, mental health, crises services and community health worker (CHW).

Measure 2: Number of meetings between CHW, Center for Living and Moro Clinic regarding specific patient needs.

2. Mental Health: The overarching goal for Mental Health is to increase service delivery and reduce stigma.

SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES:

Mental Health First Aide – Establish Mental Health First Aide training in Sherman County through the Eastern Oregon Healthy Living Alliance (EOHLA) or Greater Oregon Behavioral Health, Ins (GOBHI).

Measure 1: Class held and evaluation by participants
Increase Behavioral Health integration with Primary Care – Monitor current implementation of monthly gatherings between primary care and behavioral health.

Measure 2: Number of meetings held.

Reduce Mental Health Stigma at Point of Service and in Natural Environments – Continue to support mental health education in informal community meetings, implementation of a Pain Management group, review community support for the private waiting room area for mental health and office space available, and support Center for Living’s mobile crises service (seeing people outside the office).

Measure 3: Establish a mechanism to receive input from services users to gain their perspectives on new delivery models and physical environment changes.
Children’s Counselor in School – Support the continued expansion of the position that supports having a counselor available in Sherman schools.

Measure 4: Stable funded position.

Parent Child Interactive Therapy (PCIT) – Continue referral pattern for at-risk families to the Center for Living to conduct interactive therapy sessions in Sherman County.

Measure 1: Number of PCIT sessions conducted.
Wraparound Services- Continue to develop wraparound services for at-risk children and families.

Measure 2: Services available and delivered

3. Incentive Measures: The overarching goal for Incentive Measure area is to improve on each of the EOCCO performance measures as possible.

SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES:

Review Data – At least quarterly, review the progress on the Incentive Measures that are reportable through claims data. Discuss possible interventions in connection with resources responsible.

Measure 1: Quarterly reviews during Sherman LCAC meetings
Children’s Health Promotion: The overarching goal of Children’s Health Promotion is to have Sherman County children prepared to enter Kindergarten and have stable and supportive home environments throughout their pre-school and school years.

4. Children’s Health Promotion:

SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES:

Developmental Screens- This is a common Incentive Measure with the Four Rivers Early Learning Hub (ELH). Coordinate between child service organizations that implement the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) for children age 0-36 months and primary care practices that can verify and submit appropriate service verification.

Measure 1: Monitor quarterly number of ASQs conducted on EOCCO member’s age 0-36 months.

Number of EOCCO Plan Members age 0-6 Assigned to a Patient Centered Primary Care Home- This is a common Incentive Measure with the Four Rivers Early Learning Hub.

Measure 1: Support the Moro Clinic’s implementation of PCPCH (see above) and monitor assigned members 0-6 through semi-annual review.

Coordination with Four Rivers Early Learning Hubs- Support common goals of the CCO and ELH- The CCO and ELH share the common goal of having children grow up in stable, safe and attached family homes.

Measure 2: Semi-Annual status reports to the LCAC from members of the Four Rivers Early Learning Hub to the Sherman LCAC.

Immunization Rates – Monitor and encourage complete childhood immunization rates by age three.

Measure 3: Annual reports on percentage of children fully immunized by age three.

5. Oral Health: The overarching goal of Oral health is to increase oral health services available in Sherman County and employ evidence-based prevention strategies.

SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES:

School-based Screenings- In coordination with Advantage Dental, conduct an assessment of all Sherman School children in K-12.

Measure 1: Screenings conducted and numbers of children referred for follow-up who get additional services as needed.

First Tooth - The First Tooth program training was provided to the Moro Clinic staff.

Measure 1: Moro Clinic representatives will report on the implementation of First Tooth program on an annual basis.

Virtual Dental Home – Through tele-dentistry and the presence of an Advanced Practice Hygienist, establish a Virtual Dental Home in Sherman County.

Measure: Presence of service in Sherman County
