

- OCBHJI was founded in 2017 through a partnership with the Oregon Health Authority (OHA)
- Contract is managed by Greater Oregon Behavioral Health Inc. (GOBHI) the Eastern Oregon Coordinated Care Organization

HB 4002-Deflection Program

What is HB 4002?


- The measure removes barriers and establishes programs and policies aimed at improving access to substance use disorder (SUD) treatment. It also establishes a criminal justice framework for possession or delivery of controlled substances designed to encourage treatment over penalties such as jail or probation.
- OCBHJI/ GOBHI provides technical assistance to counties implementing Deflection programs.
- Developing county specific trainings on deflection program implementation





What is a Sequential Intercept Mapping (SIM)?

- A SIM is a workshop that assists a community in identifying system gaps of the criminal justice system as it pertains to individuals with BH needs and/or IDDs, which then informs action planning later in the workshop
- Technical assistance provided
- Counties can participate in re-mappings after:
 - Completion of prior SIM
 - Major changes within the system








What are the benefits of a SIM?

- Facilitates cross-system communication
- Helps identify underused resources
- The Center is tracking recurring gaps across Oregon that can facilitate legislative changes
- Increased probability for grant opportunities





SIM Mapping Progress as of December 2022







SIMs Completed

Since getting contract with OHA:

55 throughout Oregon-total

Will have first ever adolescent this year

Most talked about Gaps

- Delays to access treatment
- No local NAMI chapter
- Lack of sufficient housing
- Too few outreach services/Peer services pre-enrollment
- Lack of co-response teams
- No drop-off center except the ER
- Lack of detox
- Limited diversion options
- Lack of consistent screening tools
- Screening information not in electronic format or shared

Most talked about Gaps (Continued)

- Lack of specialty courts
- In-Jail Services: medication discontinuity, lack of screening for vets/military
- Courts: over-reliant on treatment courts, co-occurring disorders not understood
- Insufficient prescriptions upon release
- No medical insurance enrollment
- Not connected to community resources
- Limited access to medication-assisted treatment
- Lack of alternatives to technical violations
- Limited specialized caseloads
- High caseloads
- Lack of information sharing with probation


What is Civil Commitment Mapping?

The Civil Commitment mapping process is inspired by SIM

 It dispels any assumptions that negatively impact working relationships or the effectiveness of the civil commitment process

 Facilitates conversations focused on promoting best possible outcomes while identifying opportunities for improvement

Action plans are created to overcome identified barriers







What are the benefits of Civil Commitment?

- Cross-system collaboration
- Continuous improvement
- Better outcomes
- Greater understanding of how someone flows through the system.

Most talked about Gaps...

- Crisis walk in Centers-Including respite and Case Management/Peer Support
- Long hospital stays due to lack of placement.
- Shortage of Mental Health Examiners.
- Behavioral Health Staffing Shortage.
- Placement: Psychiatric Residential Treatment facilities, high acuity placement, short term placement, adult foster care and outpatient care.


Oregon CIT Overview

- Memphis Model
- 28 county programs
 - Portland Police Bureau (PPB) and Port of Portland programs as well
- 2023 489 crisis responders trained in CIT
 - This does not include PPB numbers
- 9 of the 12 EOCCO counties have a CIT program
